

OUTSTANDING PROMOTIONAL PROJECT/TEAM

Description

This award is presented to the team that is involved in the successful promotion of a concrete pavement project. This effort is not limited to the pavement selection but includes publicity before, during and after project completion such as open houses and creative public relations campaigns associated with a project. This award is different from the Outstanding Promoter in that it honors a team over a multi-year or multi-season effort for one specific project.

Eligibility Requirements

The concrete pavement project must have been completed within the past two years prior to June 1, 2007.

Nomination Process

Nominations will be accepted from all ACPA members, staff and Chapter/States in good standing. Only one nomination is allowed per member company, staff member or chapter. The nomination should clearly identify the obstacles to using concrete pavements that made this project a special challenge.

Selection Process

The ACPA Executive Committee will review the nominations and select the winner. Any member of the committee who is directly involved with any of the nominated projects is not eligible to participate in the review process. Any additional information necessary to evaluate this project or team is encouraged.

OUTSTANDING PROMOTER

Description

This award recognizes individual promoters who had the greatest impact on increasing concrete pavement market share locally. No more than two promoters may be honored each year.

Eligibility Requirements

All concrete pavement promoters, including ACPA members and staff, are eligible for this award. Nominees should be evaluated on their promotional efforts between June 1, 2006 and June 1, 2007.

Nomination Process

Nominations will be accepted from all ACPA members, staff and Chapter/States in good standing. Only one nomination is allowed per member company, staff member or chapter. Please limit your description to 500 words or less and include only one letter of reference.

Selection Process

The ACPA Executive Committee will review the nominations and select the winner. Any member of the committee who is directly involved with any of the nominated projects is not eligible to participate. The nominees will be evaluated based on the following:

Degree of Success

- Positive change to policies that impact pavement selection
- Impact on the total market segment
- Change in "how we do business"
- Rapport with specifiers
- Interaction with industry
- Press release, ads, magazine articles
- Presentations – workshops, consultants, city, etc.
- Open houses

- For the industry
- For the association

OUTSTANDING HEALTH, SAFETY & ENVIRONMENTAL STEWARDSHIP

Description

This award recognizes companies, government agencies, or individuals for their contributions to improving health, safety and environmental stewardship in the concrete pavement industry.

Eligibility Requirements

All ACPA members, government employees and the transportation agencies they represent are eligible for nomination. Private citizens and organizations outside the transportation-construction community are also eligible, however, first consideration will be given to candidates from the transportation community.

Nominees should be evaluated on their efforts between June 1, 2006 and June 1, 2007.

Nomination Process

Nominations will be accepted from all ACPA members, staff and Chapter/States in good standing. Only one nomination is allowed per member company, staff member or chapter.

Selection Process

The ACPA Executive Committee will review the nominations and select the winner. Any member of the committee who is directly involved with any of the nominated projects is not eligible to participate. The nominees will be evaluated based on the following:

- Accident or incident prevention
- Improvement in environmental impact performance
- Development and implementation of environmental best management practices
- Demonstration of practices related to environmental stewardship
- Improvements to plant or job-site safety
- Improvements in workzone safety
- Innovation or improvement in health related processes and/or practices.

OUTSTANDING MATERIAL SUPPLIER

Description

This award recognizes ACPA member companies, individuals or teams of company employees, whose materials¹ (or expendable products other than equipment); service; or technological improvements have contributed to the increased quality, cost effectiveness or overall performance of concrete pavement, or that have an outstanding legacy of effective use in concrete pavement.

Eligibility Requirements

All ACPA members, as well as cement producers, ready mixed concrete producers, chemical admixture producers, and other related construction support material manufacturers offering products are eligible for nomination.

Nominees should be evaluated on their efforts between June 1, 2006 and June 1, 2007.

Nomination Process

Nominations will be accepted from all ACPA members, staff and Chapter/States in good standing and by ACPA affiliates. Only one nomination is allowed per member company, staff member or chapter.

Selection Process

The ACPA Executive Committee will review the nominations and select the winner. Any member of the committee who is directly involved with any of the nominated projects is not eligible to participate in the review process. The nominees will be evaluated based on the following:

- Meritorious service by a materials manufacturer/supplier to a public agency, contractor, or to the concrete pavement industry-at-large.
- Technological improvements (resulting from materials science, process chemistry, or other manufacturing enhancements).
- Exemplary product enhancements, new products, or product line extensions that contribute to concrete pavement product or process efficiencies.

¹ For purposes of this award, "materials" refers to aggregates, cement, concrete, chemical additives or intermediates, reinforcements, fabricated products (other than those in the equipment category), software, or other products used in the construction, maintenance and rehabilitation of concrete pavements.

OUTSTANDING EQUIPMENT SUPPLIER

Description

This award recognizes ACPA member companies, individuals or teams of company employees, whose equipment²; product support service; or technological improvements have contributed to the increased quality, cost effectiveness or overall performance of concrete pavement, or that have an outstanding legacy of effective use in concrete pavement.

Eligibility Requirements

All ACPA members representing the ACPA Equipment Division. ACPA members may also be considered from the ACPA Contractor Division or Materials Division, or from Consultant categories, providing their equipment (as defined in the footnote) are not inextricably tied to the use of proprietary materials.

Nominees should be evaluated on their efforts between June 1, 2006 and June 1, 2007.

Nomination Process

Nominations will be accepted from all ACPA members, staff and Chapter/States in good standing and by ACPA affiliates. Only one nomination is allowed per member company, staff member or chapter.

Selection Process

The ACPA Executive Committee will review the nominations and select the winner. Any member of the committee who is directly involved with any of the nominated projects is not eligible to participate in the review process. The nominees will be evaluated based on the following:

- Meritorious service to a public agency, contractor, or to the concrete pavement industry-at-large.
- Technological improvements (resulting in time savings, cost reduction, performance improvements or contributions to improved safety, health, or environmental performance.)
- Exemplary equipment enhancements, new products, or product line extensions that contribute to concrete pavement product or process efficiencies.

² For purposes of this award, "equipment" refers to equipment, machines, batch plants, instruments, power tools, hand tools, trucks and truck apparatus, process controllers, and other fabricated products (other than those in the materials category) used in the construction, maintenance and rehabilitation of concrete pavements. Also, this award category will apply to certain expendable products used on or in conjunction with machines, instruments, or equipment. Examples of "expendables" could include safety devices used on equipment, blades, cutting bits, forms, and other devices used in pavement and bridge deck construction and rehabilitation.

HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

Description

Election of Honorary Life Membership in the American Concrete Pavement Association is reserved for those who, in the opinion of the Executive Committee, have rendered outstanding service to the concrete pavement industry and to the Association. Nominations can be made by any board member, provided the person making the initial nomination has no direct business affiliation with the nominee. The candidate considered should be retired or retiring from active service to the Association. With the exception of 1995, no more than two (2) persons will be elected to Honorary Life Membership each year.

Eligibility Requirements

Each nominee should meet the criteria of not less than three (3) of the following requirements:

- Worked for the ACPA, PCA, Paving Division, Chapter, or State Paving Association for a minimum of ten (10) years.
- Service of not less than eight (8) years of member of the Board of Directors or a committee member.
- Chairmanship of the Board of Directors.
- Chairmanship of at least two standing committees.
- One or more significant accomplishments contributing to the advancement of the concrete paving industry.
- One or more significant accomplishments contributing to the advancement of the Association.
- The achievement of outstanding business eminence of special significance to the Association or to the concrete paving industry.

Nomination Process

The nomination must include a petition from at least eight members of the Board of Directors showing support for the nominee. A brief (limited to one page) biography of each nominee must be submitted with the nomination.

Selection Process

The nomination petitions will be reviewed by the Executive Committee. The two petitions that receive the most votes will be honored each year. Any person nominated to be an Honorary Life Member and is not selected will be automatically considered for the next year.
